In the 2009 World Summit on Food Security Five principles were unanimously adopted which represent a new consensus on global food security.

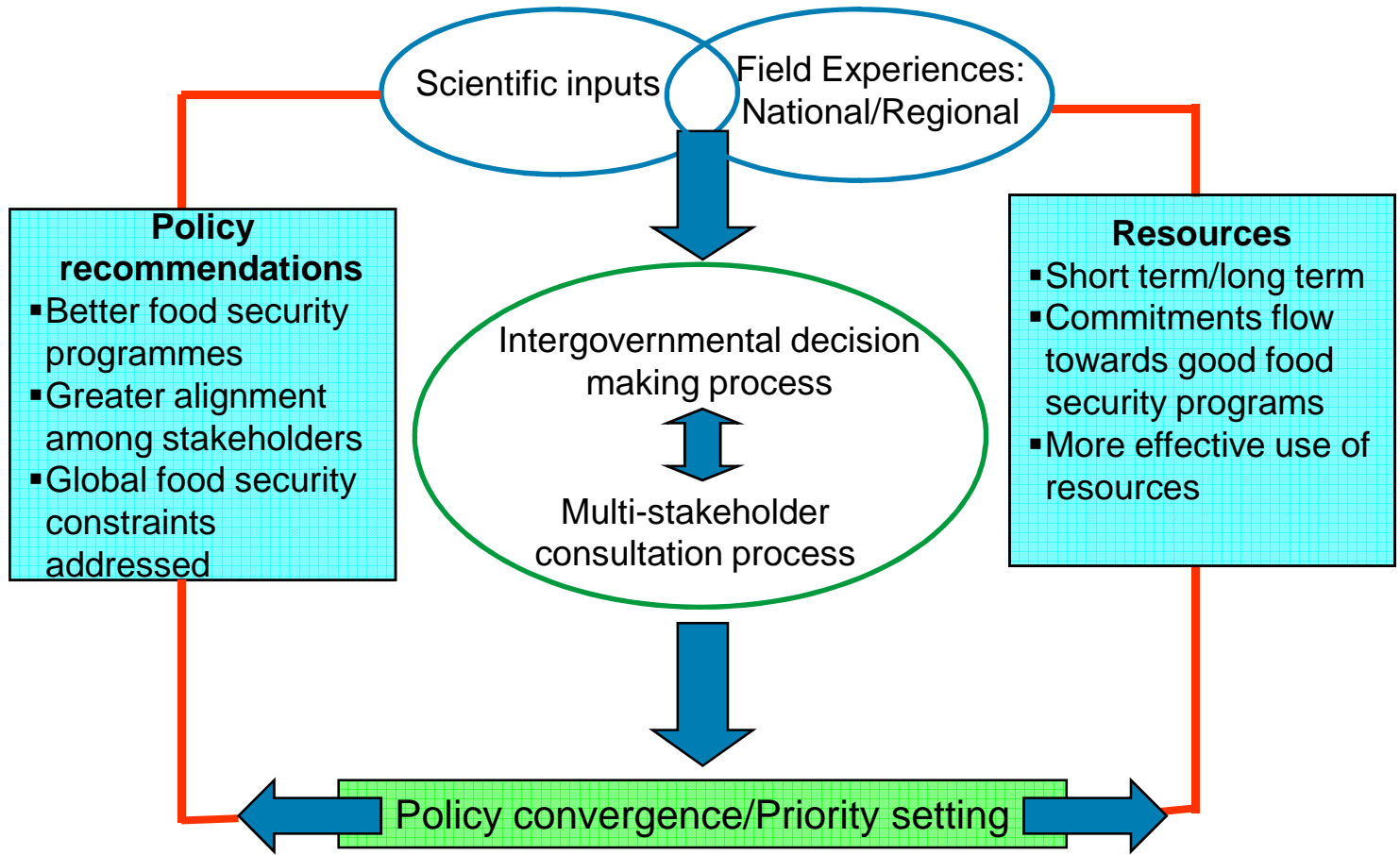
Principle 2 provides support to CFS:

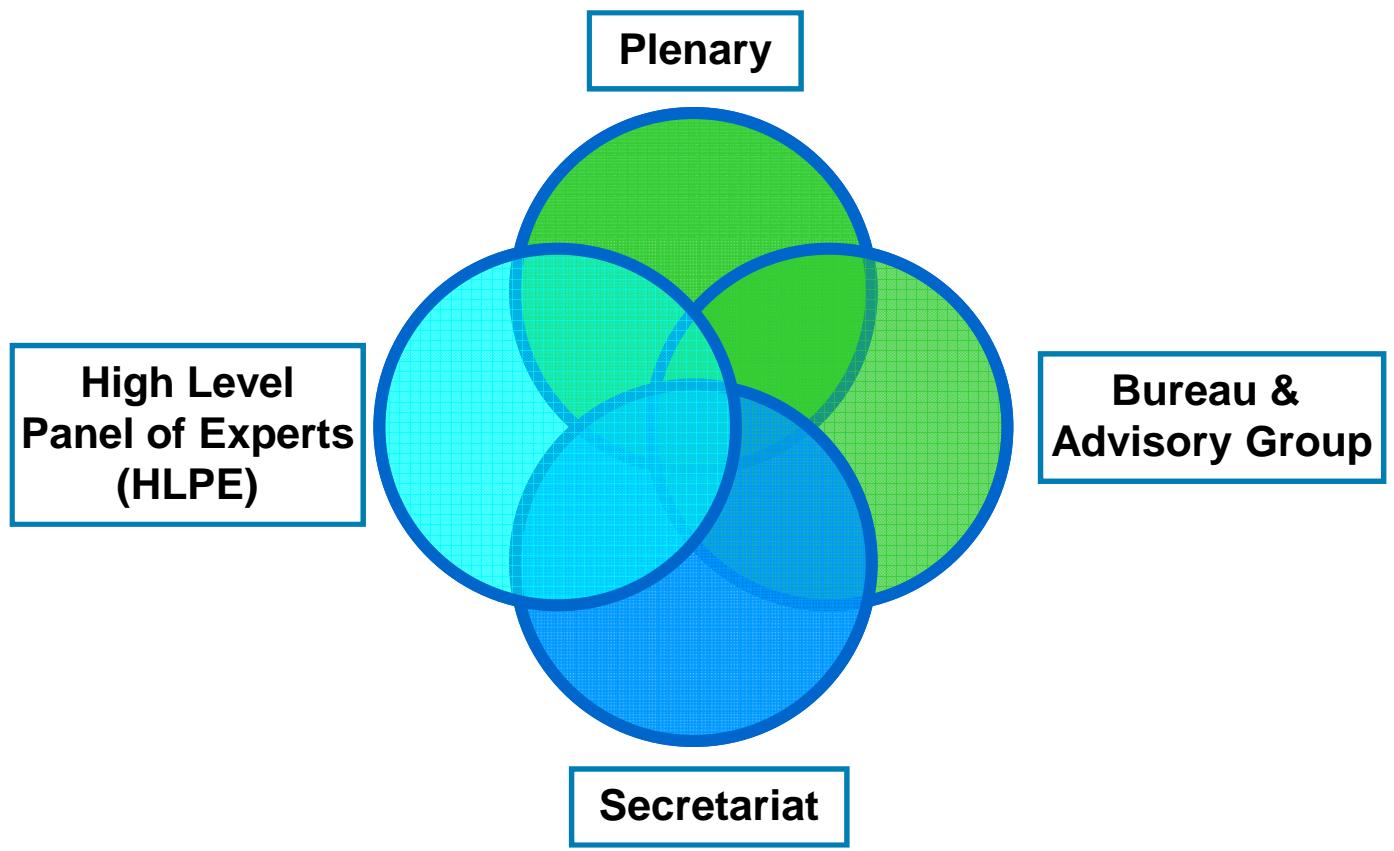

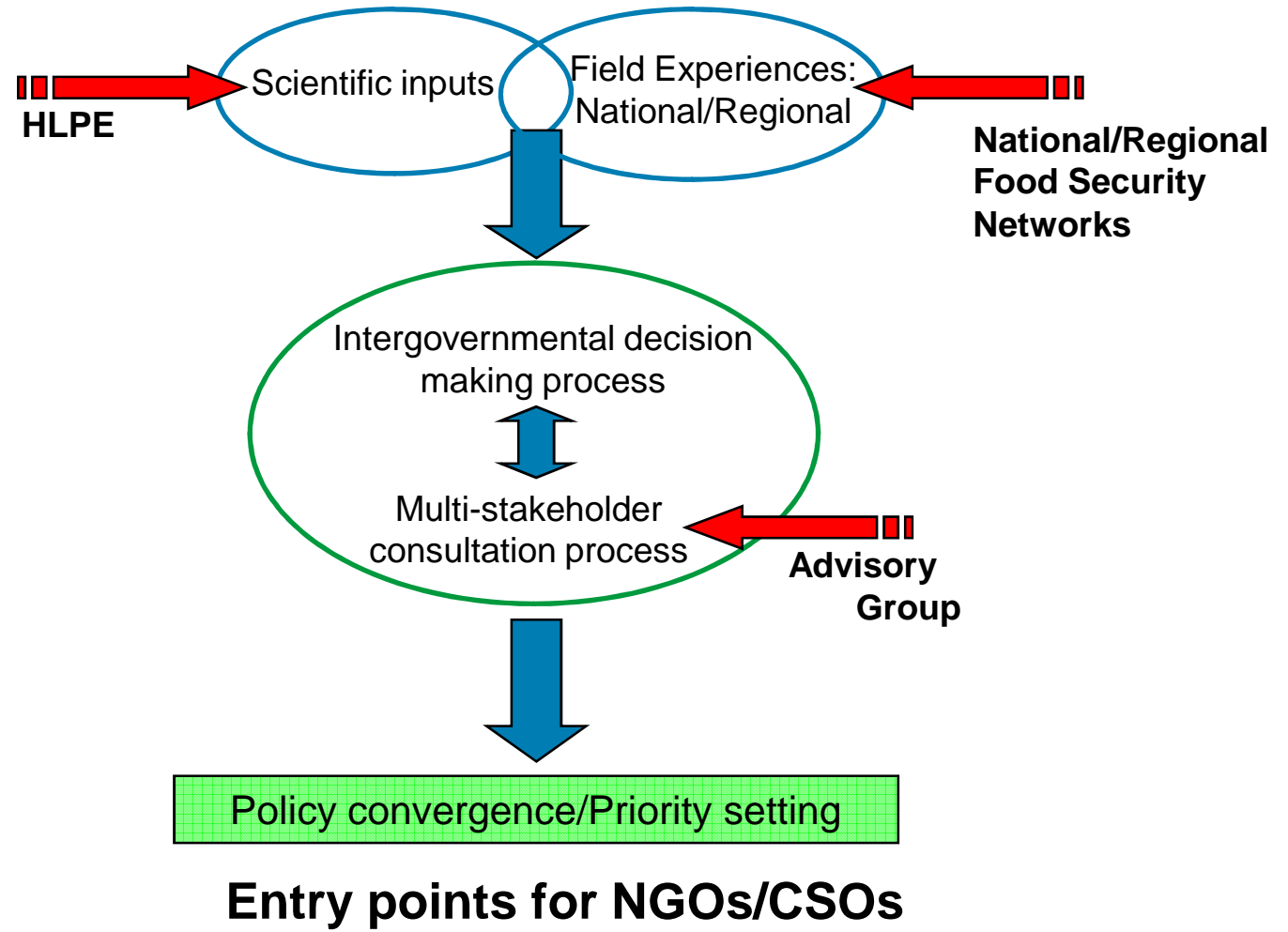
